How to participate

- attend!
- you initiate, organizers decide
 - submit content
 - papers, posters, panels, tutorials, doctoral colloquium, workshops...
 - submit student volunteer application
 - submit your name to available paper reviewers database (PCS)
- by invitation
 - program committee: papers chairs propose, steering committee approves
 - 3 year terms, rotate off for at least one year
 - organizer: see next slide!
- you initiate, VEC decides
 - general chair

VEC:VIS Executive Committee

- 2 reps from each conf steering committee: VAST, InfoVis, SciVis
- VGTC Chair (Vis and Graphics Tech Cttee, oversight for many conf)
 - VGTC Vice-Chair Conferences
 - up to 2 VGTC Directors
 - up to 1 member at large
 - VEC Chair
- size range from 6 to 11 so far
- 6 year term limits
- decisions
 - bids for future general chairs
 - symposium proposals
 - policy (multi-year, cross-conf)

Organizing Committee (OC)

- VEC decides: multi-year Program, Finance, Web
- VGTC Chair proposes, VEC approves: Publications
- Steering Committees (SCs) appoint
 - Papers, Posters
- SCs propose one each, GC approves
 - Panels, Tutorials, Workshops, Exhibits, Colloq, Publicity, Meetups, Industry
- GC appoints
 - FastForwards, Art Show, Local Arrangements, others
- previous chairs propose, GC approves
 - Student Volunteers (SVs), Contests

- functions
 - deciding the roster (Papers, Posters, Panels, Workshops, Tutorials, Doctoral Colloquium, Meetups, Exhibitions, Publicity, etc.)
 - approving SciVis Program Committee proposed by Papers Chairs
 - approving SciVis Best Paper Award Committee proposed by Papers Chairs
 - looking forward
- metrics for roster selection
 - scholarship (authors and reviewers)
 - organizing experience
 - a healthy mix of academia and industry; research interest; gender; geography
- program committee: 3 years term max, rotate off with at least one year between terms
- (typical) path to participate:
 - authors, reviewers, program committee members, chairs

Student volunteers: Selection guidelines documented

- full documentation at <http://www.vissv.org>
- point system: contribution type, experience, seniority
- cap of 3 per institution and 2 per advisor
- cap of 3 years unless transition to supervisory
- 75% slots to top scorers modulo caps, tiebreaks for diversity
- 25% weighted lottery for new blood
- 3 chairs, 3 year term, one on/off per year
 - chosen by previous chairs from SV supervisors
