



Good afternoon!


Today's Tuesday Tea will take place at 4pm in the 8th floor lounge.

We have a special treat today as incoming grad Nodir Kodirov is providing us with dried fruits, nuts, chocolates and other sweets from Uzbekistan.


So, come on up to the 8th floor this afternoon to enjoy some delicious tea, treats, and conversation with your fellow department members.


I have to admit that the Yogurt UDLS kind of took me by surprise, but I am sure, we can figure something out for tonight!


talk to your fellow grad students in a social totally casual way. Thus, I hope to see you all at one or the other event!



The dethroned Mihail has not abandoned you, and will bring some delicious pecan tarts and lemon tarts.


