

Parts of the Boat

- There are no "Ropes" on a Boat
- Halyard – Raises the Sail
- Sheet – Pulls in the Sail or lets it out
- Usage: "Main Sheet", "Jib Sheet", etc.






When properly set the sails will lay parallel to each other.



Shift jib to other side



Overtaking

When both boats are on the same tack, the boat clear astern shall keep clear of the boat it is overtaking. It cannot run into the back of the boat it is overtaking. But unlike the rules of the road, once the boat astern overlaps the overtaken boat, this rule switches off and the windward-leeward rule turns on where the windward boat shall keep clear.
